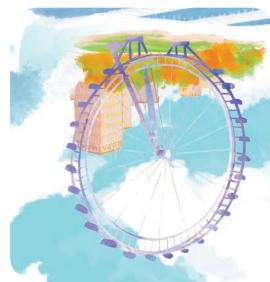


Queen's Horse Guard
These guards on horseback have been standing watch at the entrance to Buckingham Palace since 1660. Their changing ceremony takes place daily.



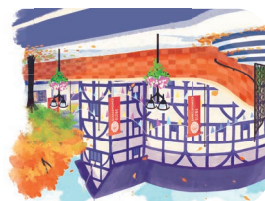
The London Eye

This world-famous clock tower - officially called the Elizabeth Tower has kept exact time for the nation since 1859.



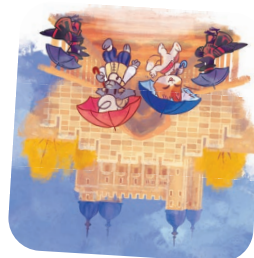
Buckingham Palace
