Did You Know?

Yellowstone is the oldest National Park, created in 1872 over 125 years ago. Yellowstone features Old Faithful, a famous geyser that shoots water over one hundred feet into the air. The geyser was named Old Faithful because it has been erupting around 17 times a day since it was discovered.

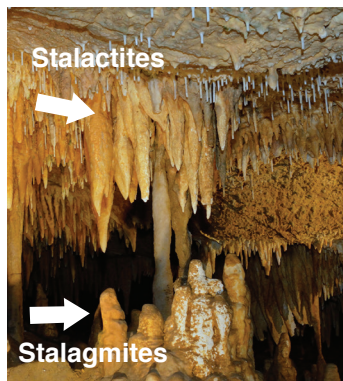

Caverns

Stalactites and Stalagmites

Some National Parks have caverns or caves you can explore. A cave is a large opening in the ground, a hill, or a cliff. Often you will see formations from the ceiling and on the floor of a cave. These are from water droplets containing minerals dripping slowly over time. They are called **stalactites** (from the ceiling) and **stalagmites** (on the floor). KeeKee remembers the difference by thinking that stalactites hang *tight* to the ceiling.

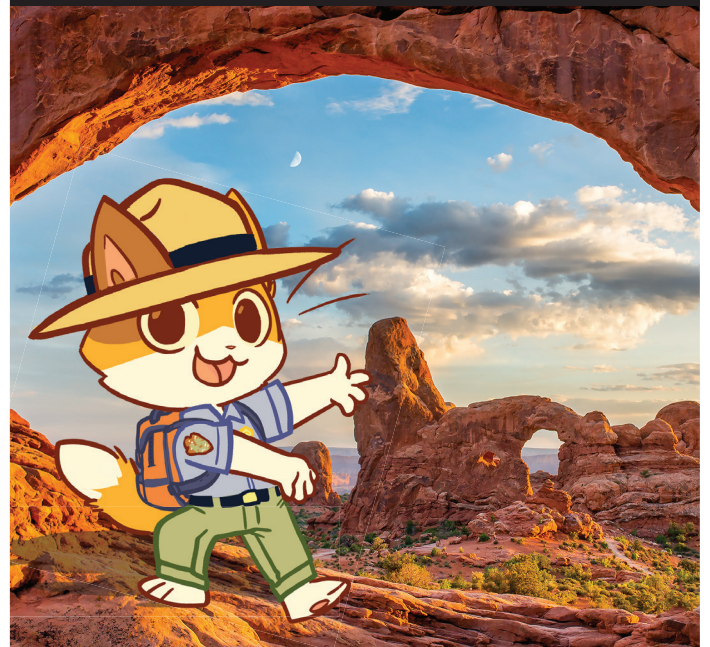
